**Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1**

Government Degree College, Kanigiri is affiliated to Acharya Nagarjuna University, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh. Recently it has been affiliated to the Andhra Kesari Tanguturi Prakasam University, Ongole. Four years Degree programme was implemented as per NEP-2020 guidelines from academic session, 2023-24. To ensure effective curriculum delivery, the college encourages faculty members to attend orientation programs, refresher courses, and subject-wise bridge courses. Additionally, field trips to historical places are organized to provide practical knowledge and to develop observation skills. Before the academic year begins, departmental meetings are held to discuss plans, additional inputs, certificate courses, and departmental activities. Some faculties are nominated as members of Board of Studies. The college also focuses on improving communication and language skills by conducting language and soft skills classes. Online quizzes and remedial classes are organized for students categorized learners. Students participate in student seminars, quizzes, and group discussions. The curriculum is supplemented by add-on and need-based certificate courses to enhance student competencies. The CBCS semester pattern allocates 25 marks for internal evaluation and 75 marks for external evaluation in each subject. The college values feedback from faculty members, students and parents. It establishes a formal system of feedback on programs. Each faculty member prepares an annual academic curriculum plan, as per syllabus, additional inputs, and curricular and co-curricular activities. A subject-wise lesson plan is also prepared for effective content delivery. Faculty members maintain a teaching diary to record their academic activities, and attendance is recorded through the IAMS app. Government Degree College, Kanigiri, focuses on effective curriculum delivery through teaching, learning, and evaluation. The college provides various opportunities for faculty development and student engagement. It follows the prescribed curriculum and incorporates additional activities to enhance the quality of teaching and learning.

Human values and professional ethics which has a structured syllabus is studied by all students as a foundation course for two credits. Environmental studies is pursued in third semester. The students understand the importance to be given for keeping the globe green and hospitable. The college conducts a number of programs on the environment such as planting saplings etc. Gender related issues are being addressed in the selection of topics for various courses in languages and history modules. Women Empowerment Cell takes up gender related problems and projects. Teachers use ICT as much as in pedagogy while digital classrooms take care of the modern methods. National Integration is integrated into the curriculum of domain specific courses of History, Telugu and English.

#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 2

The curriculum prescribed by the Acharya Nagarjuna University, Guntur has provisions in programs and syllabus to give the students experiential and participative learning experiences such as field trips, industry visits, rural visits and surveys to understand the geographical, social-political and economic factors of the lives of the people in the rural areas. The college imparts several Add-On/ Certificate courses to enable students to acquire additional skills for raising their employability. Departmental student class seminars are also conducted by the lecturers. Students organise functions/events and festivals like Fresher's meet, farewell parties and cultural programs. Two students participated in state level quiz competition conducted by the Andhra Pradesh Higher Education Department and two students secured gold medals in "Athletic All India National Federation Cup -2022" and in Javelin throw event. Students take part in several extra-and co-curricular activities like cleanliness drive, tree-planting, Swachh Bharath program, Blood donation program, social surveys and awareness programs organized by the college. The lecturers use ICT tools to enhance the teaching learning process. The college has Wi-Fi and ICT enabled class room.

The Government Degree College, Kanigiri adheres to the examination pattern and guidelines set by Acharya Nagarjuna University. An examination committee is formed annually to co-ordinate internal and external examination activities and communicate relevant information to students, lecturers and administrative staff. These assessments typically include one or two tests per semester, excluding mid-term exams. Students are encouraged to interact with their lecturers to resolve any assessment-related concerns. The evaluation of internal assessment tests is conducted by the respective department's lecturers and the marks are received and reviewed by the departments to ensure transparency. The college has a transparent, time-bound mechanism to handle grievances related to internal examinations. The college also maintains a web-enabled internal assessment and attendance management system, where assignment and mid-test marks are uploaded for students to access.

The University and Andhra Pradesh State Council Higher Education (APSCHE) developed Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), Programme Outcomes (POs), and Course Outcomes (COs) which have been implemented

n the college. The admission committee also helps in making the students understand the courses to be undertaken so that they can decide which programs/courses suit them the best. The program outcomes and program specific outcomes are assessed but needs to be improved using robust methods like Bloom's taxonomy. There are 4 guest faculties with one contract teacher. Student enrolment is very low as compared to the sanctioned strength which needs to be improved. The number of students reaching final year is unsatisfactory due to high drop-out rate. The college has organized workshops for students to orient them on MS. The staff members are involved with the e-content creation according to the University syllabus. Faculty members have created study materials, PPTs and video presentation of the content which are uploaded into the LMS.

**Qualitative analysis of Criterion 3**

The Research Advisory Committee has to be made functional. The teaching faculties have a few publications. So far no initiative has been made to create awareness of the Indian Knowledge System. Some teachers attended Faculty Development Programmes as part of Career development. Basic Science programmes in undergraduate level and few post-graduate Programmes in Humanities are to be started. The NSS unit organized a residential seven day camp in the adopted village to address issues on hygiene, tree plantation and water conservation. During the pandemic, the college students created awareness among the local communities. Addressing a few social issues on gender disparity, sanitation and water harvesting would help the local communities as this is a drought-prone backward region. During the last five years around 250 students participated in various extension activities. Staff members are to be encouraged to deliver academic lectures in different sponsored events conducted in other higher educational institutions. The college should develop an Incubation Centre for creation and transfer of knowledge. Four teachers have completed Ph.D. This region has granite mining industry. Some of the students undertook project work and also industrial visits. By signing MOUs with these industrial centres an environment conducive for start ups and budding entrepreneurs can be initiated.

This college has 16.04 acres of land area. It has three buildings, seven ventilated classrooms, one digital classroom and one gymnasium. There are four washrooms separately available for ladies and gents. But they should be regularly cleaned and maintained. The college has a total of 08 computers. There are 30 laptops for skill enhancement courses. The college has a play ground. Ladies common room with necessary amenities has to be provided. The office is equipped with computers and internet connectivity. The internet connectivity backed up with a 4MBPS broadband has to be augmented. The college has installed four CCTV cameras. One LCD projector is available for conducting webinars and seminars. Information technology related facilities are to be enhanced for the benefit of all the students and teachers. To promote physical fitness, there is gymnasium with weight lifting and power lifting platforms. Girl students are to be encouraged to use it. Canteen facility is to be established. The college should have proper policies to maintain and upkeep of the infrastructure. Facilities like volley-ball, badminton, kho-kho, kabaddi and indoor facilities like chess and carrom are available for sportspersons. Two students were bestowed with national level awards in sports events held at Amritsar. More students may be encouraged to actively participate in sports events in regional, national and international levels. Students may be encouraged to participate in extra-curricular activities. The college library has 3781 books including a few reference documents. It subscribes to few local magazines and four dailies. The librarian post is to be filled. Efforts are to be made to procure the latest editions of reference documents. By awarding prizes walk-ins may be improved. The degree examination question papers of the affiliating University are kept in the library for benefit of the students. Hostels are to be constructed for both girls and boys. Transport facility is to be provided through the APSRTC.

The Principal is assisted by CPDC, Teaching staff, Alumni, parents and students. Principal conducts the General Meeting in which decisions regarding new academic programs and infrastructure are finalized. The IQAC co-ordinates the work of various committees. Academic coordinator monitors various certificate courses and diploma courses. Teachers are assigned responsibility of organizing and managing the events in order to bring out the leadership qualities among the students. The institution practices decentralized and participatory management and system of governance to expedite decision making and provide quality service to all the stake holders. There are different cells, committees and units to look into different activities of the institution. The Institution encourages all stakeholders to have an active role in the development of academic plans, its implementation and decision-making processes. All service rules, reservation policies and procedures are strictly followed. Service Books are maintained and updated regularly by the office. The institution has effective welfare measures and Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff. All welfare policies of the government for employees are implemented. Special casual leave to perform University duties, to participate in Orientation Programme, Refresher Courses, Short term courses, Faculty Development Programmes is provided to the staff. For teaching faculty, the UGC CAS rules are applicable for placement and promotion. Both internal and external financial audit should be conducted regularly. The Academic and administrative audit should be conducted by inviting academic experts. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) reviews Teaching learning process, and learning outcomes at periodic intervals. It has formed seven criterion wise committees to monitor the institute's policies and processes. It has encouraged skill enhancement and community service programmes. The College should provide a compound wall to prevent cattle grazing and trespassers to maintain a safe, secure and supportive environment. ### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 7

The college has constituted Anti-Ragging Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, and Women Development Cell to ensure the safety and security of the female students. Four CCTV cameras have been installed for safety. The college celebrates International Women's Day, International Yoga Day, Independence and Republic Day, Constitution Day, International Human Rights Day, World Population Day, National Voters Day. Mahatma Gandhi Birth Anniversary is observed as an international non-violence day. Students of all categories are given admission in the college as per the reservation policy of the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The staff members and students from various cultural backgrounds actively promote harmony, tolerance, and integrity. There is gender disparity as enrolment of girl students is very less, E-waste is disposed through the State Department of Mines and Geology. Non-biodegradable solid waste like plastics, polythene bags and junk food parcels are totally banned inside the campus. Vermi-composting pits should be created to decompose the bio-degradable waste. Majority of the students of the college belong to surrounding rural areas and have to travel a long distance. The College has introduced Mid-Day Meal Programme through local philanthropists to increase attendance of the students and to reduce gender disparity. Student attendance in the post-lunch session classes has improved. The College has introduced special Skill-oriented courses, soft skills, interview skills, basic computer skills. Skill centre has been established in the college premises with the help of the Andhra Pradesh State Skill Development Corporation. National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of the College has adopted village Machavaram. It has conducted special camps in the village covering the marginal communities. Under Swachh Bharat campaign the volunteers promote cleanliness in public places and sanitation in the village. The volunteers spread Covid awareness, preventive measures and importance of vaccination. They also disseminate knowledge about basic healthcare practices, personal hygiene, nutrition, and the importance of regular health check-ups. Eye Check-up Service is organized for senior citizens.
