1. Abundant — Existing in large quantities

Ex: The garden was filled with abundant flowers in spring

2. Ambiguous: Having more than one meaning

Eg: His answer was ambiguous, making it hard to understand his point

3. Benevolent: Kind and generous

Eg: The benevolent man donated a huge amount to charity

4. Compelling: Evoking interest, attention or admiration

Eg: The documentary presented a compelling argument on climate change

5. Conventional: Following traditional or commonly accepted ideas

Eg: He prefers conventional methods over modern techniques.

6. Credible:

Believable and Trustworthy

Eg: The Scientist presented a Credible explanation for the phenomenon

7. Eloquent:

Fluent and persuasive in speaking or writing

Eg: The speaker gave an eloquent speech at the Conference

8. Exquisite:

Extremely beautiful or delicate

Eg: The artist's work was exquisite, capturing every detail perfectly

9. Futile:

Useless, having no effect

Eg: His efforts to fix the broken watch were futile

10. Pristine:

Pure, clean and untouched

Eg: The Beach had pristine white sand and clear blue water

11. Compelling:

Evoking interest, attention & admiration

Eg: The documentary presented a Compelling argument on climate change.

12. Contemplate

To think deeply about something

Eg: He sat by the window to contemplate his future plans

13. Ephemeral:

Lasting for a very short time

Eg: The beauty of sunset is ephemeral lasting only a few minutes

14. Impartial:

Treating all sides equally, without bias

Eg: The judge remained impartial during the trial

15. Intricate:

Very detailed & complicated

Eg: The embroidery on the fabric was Intricate and delicate

16. Lucrative

Producing a lot of money; profitable

Eg: He started a lucrative business in the tech industry

17. Perplexed :

Confused or puzzled

Eg: She was perplexed by the difficult maths problem

Scrutinize :

To examine something very carefully

Eg: The professor scrutinized every detail of the research paper.

To do better than expected or go beyond

Eg: His performance surpassed all expectations

Easily harmed or affected
